Our General Objective

The Corporation is organized and operated for charitable, scientific, literary and educational purposes and for the transaction of any and all lawful business for which corporations may be organized under the Revised Iowa Nonprofit Corporation Act.

- 7. To perform and support scientific research concerning golf and golf related subjects including turfgrass, environmental practices and impact, and to make available to the public the results of such research.
- To solicit and receive gifts, bequests, donations, contributions, and conveyances of real estate, stocks, 8. securities, commodities, monies, property, and other gifts in furtherance of the purposes set forth

President's Message

2022 Year in Review



Friends and supporters of the IGA Foundation, 2022 was a landmark year for the IGAF.

Normally, I'd cover all of the different aspects of our foundation and the progress we've made. This year, I'm going to do something a little different. I'm going to focus on a project that provides a platform for all the wonderful IGAF initiatives to grow and thrive in a way none of us could have imagined a few short years ago.

The IGA's office is currently located in a modest commercial suite in Ankeny. On the walls of that office are plaques for all of our Iowa Golf Hall of Fame members, books, trophies, and memorabilia representing a rich history of golf from our great state. There's just one problem. Unless you have a specific reason to go to their office, you'd never know it's there. We've never had a true home to display and educate golfers from our state about the amazing accomplishments of all our great players. I remember Bill Dickens chatting with Chad and me nearly a decade ago and saying how amazing it would be if we had a "golf house" to properly display and honor Iowa's golf history.

Two years ago, Echo Valley owner Michael Coppola provided a gift that made that dream feel attainable. A beautiful piece of land that sits adjacent to the 9th hole on the Creek Course at Echo Valley Country Club. Since then, a small team has been working diligently to make Golf House Iowa a reality. Earlier this year, we made a public announcement with the goal to break ground in Spring 2023. I'm excited to report that we're making significant progress toward that goal, but we need your help.

If you're wondering what Golf House Iowa is and why it's so important to the game in our state, allow me a few lines to paint that picture. Golf House Iowa will provide the following...

- A permanent home for the Iowa Golf Hall of Fame and Museum
- Office Space for the Iowa Golf Association, the

Iowa Golf Course Superintendent's Association, and the First Tee - Central Iowa

- An interactive space for youth, including First Tee participants, to learn about the core fundamentals our great game teaches
- A space for our IGA staff to teach the rules of the game in a setting that creates hands-on learning and real-life scenarios
- A formal facility for the Superintendent's Association to begin expanding its STEM programs that focus on agronomy

The following pages will show you more about the wonderful programs the IGAF facilitates each year, but Golf House Iowa provides a permanent structure to allow us to grow and deepen those programs.

The Biggest Project in IGA History

There has never been a permanent home for the Iowa Golf Hall of Fame.

The IGA relies on its member clubs to provide space for seminars, meetings, and other routine business that benefits the game. Since the late 1990's, the IGA has moved its office three times.

Organizations such as the Iowa Golf Course Superintendents Association and First Tee - Central Iowa have either moved multiple times or do not currently have a central office.

Imagine a physical location centrally located in the state that would honor those that came before us in golf, serve those playing the game today, and develop those that will enjoy this game long after us, as well as serve as a hub from which multiple groups with compatible missions could do what they do more effectively and more efficiently.

With that in mind, we have the vision to create "Golf House Iowa".

The creation of Golf House Iowa will provide a permanent home to preserve, promote, and protect the game of golf in our great state. We plan to include the Iowa Golf Hall of Fame and Museum, a space for educating golfers, areas to promote and teach the game, and office space for the Iowa Golf Association, IGA Foundation, and other related golf organizations.

Barbara (Bubany) Berkmeyer

Barbara (Bubany) Berkmeyer's success on the golf course goes back over six decades. Born in Fort Madison, Berkmeyer began swinging the club at age four, under the watchful eye of her father, Frank. There was no doubt she was destined to become an accomplished player.

After moving in 1952 to Ottumwa, Berkmeyer continued to hone her golf skills by playing across the state. At age 10, Berkmeyer participated in the 1954 Southeast Iowa Women's Championship, an event that attracted the best female golfers from Iowa, Missouri, Kansas and Illinois. Within a few years she was a consistent top-five finisher at the event, winning the overall title in 1965, with runner-up finishes in 1964 and 1966. Her career as an amateur golfer was off and running.

Following stops in Davenport and ultimately in St. Louis, MO, Berkmeyer, who was already an accomplished player in her home-state of Iowa, began to make a name for herself in Missouri. Soon after arriving, Berkmeyer captured the 1962 St. Louis Women's District Golf Association Junior Girls' Championship, which helped earn her the first women's athletic scholarship in the history of the University of Missouri, regardless of sport.

At the age of 21, Berkmeyer, won the first of her five (1965, 1970, 1974, 1975 and 1984) Missouri Women's Golf Association State Championships. Many more tournament wins followed, while always crediting her Iowa golf pedigree to her success.

"The swing my dad taught me back at Fort Madison Country Club has served me well," Berkmeyer once said. "I learned how to play the game and compete growing up in Iowa. That experience was invaluable."

Berkmeyer has competed in a total of 11 USGA Championships over her playing career, including five Women's Amateurs, two Mid-Amateurs and four Senior Women's Amateurs. She finished runner-up in the 2002 U.S. Senior Women's Amateur and made it to the Round of 16 in 1999 and 2000. She was the runner-up of the 2002 Canadian Ladies National Senior Championship and she has won the Missouri Senior Women's Amateur title 13 times.

As a full-time middle school teacher for 25 years, Berkmeyer has been inducted into the St. Louis Sports Hall of Fame, Missouri Sports Hall of Fame and the University of Missouri Sports Hall of Fame.


"Her respect, kindness, courage and talent are second to none," Jim Holtgrieve, two-time Walker Cup Captain said. "Barbara is an absolute perfect role model for the future of women's golf."

Mark Egly

Mark Egly has been teaching and, more importantly, introducing golfers to the game for over 40 years. It would be very difficult to put a number on the golfers that Egly has helped and influenced in his teaching. Egly has been named Iowa PGA Teacher of the year seven times. He has received countless awards from Golf Range Magazine and Golf Digest for his teaching accomplishments.

Egly is also an accomplished player in his own right, having won the 1988 Iowa PGA Match Play Championship, 1990 Iowa Open Championship, and numerous other Iowa PGA events when he was coming up as a player. After suffering an injury in a car accident, Mark has since changed to help golf games of others throughout his teaching career.


"I have known Mark for over 30 years, and rarely have I seen anyone with his passion for teaching the game," Iowa Golf Hall of Fame member Ken Schall said. "I travelled with Mark often in our younger years playing in mini tour events and state opens.

He was always a force to be reckoned with. What I am most impressed with is his positive influence with junior golfers. Mark has donated his practice facility and his time to the First Tee - Central Iowa for many years now."

Egly's teaching resume can be stacked up against anyone – as he was the lead instructor at Des Moines Golf & Country Club in 1979, Willow Creek Golf Course from 1980-84 and Des Moines Driving Range from 1994 to present day, taking ownership in 2002.

"Mark has taught thousands of golf lessons and has become renowned with helping high school golfers and many times at little or no charge," Iowa Golf Hall of Fame member Jeff Smith said. "Over the past 20 years Mark has been recognized for nearly 40 awards."

Egly's lessons don't just end with the fundamentals

of golf.

"More importantly, the legacy that Mark leads leaves an impression on the lives of others and encourages them to do the same," former student Victoria Grasso said. "Mark is one of the reasons why I have chosen to pursue a career in coaching women's college golf, as I desire to help make a difference in the lives of others just as Mark has done for every person that he has taught."

It has been said that no one has given away more free range balls than Mark Egly. It's safe to say not many have helped grow the game more than him either.

Charles (Charlie) Pribble was ahead of his time – plain and simple.

With stops as Head Golf Superintendent at Quincy (IL) Country Club, Sunnyside Country Club and

Airport National Golf Course, Pribble always had time to help his fellow superintendent, regardless of their location.

"He mentored numerous young men who also became first class superintendents," Iowa Golf Hall of Fame member Steve Tyler said. "Being very innovative, I believe Charlie was the first to ever grind the back of a greens mower bed knife off to get to a .10 inch cutting height. Toro, Jacobsen and others then saw the need for this and began to manufacture them for general use. He also took a poorly-constructed Sunnyside CC and made it into one of the best in Iowa."

Pribble was also an irrigation expert, being one of the first to understand the hydraulics of irrigation and system design. He designed many systems and advised on numerous irrigation projects for other superintendents.

"I will always believe that my career was shaped very strongly by the hours I spent talking with Charlie in those first days as a Superintendent," former Iowa Turfgrass Institute Executive Director Jeff Wendel said. "Charlie spared his time without expectation or payment."

Pribble, who was the IGCSA President in 1979, Superintendent of the Year in 1984, was awarded the Distinguished Service Award in 2007 and Meritorious Service Award in 2008, was truly a one of a kind superintendent.

"No matter how unorthodox or out of the box his methods might have been, he got the job done with the money and budget he had to work with," Iowa



Golf Hall of Fame member Rick Tegtmeier said.

Iowa PGA Executive Director Greg Mason may of said it best in regards to Pribble.

"Pribble's accomplishments cannot just be placed on a piece of paper," Mason said. "Talk with the people that have served with him in association work or like me as a friend and colleague in the game of golf, work and life. We all saw it first-hand. Whether he was yelling at you or laughing at you, you always knew he was pulling for you to succeed. There is no telling how many people 'Pribbs' has touched in his profession in terms of wisdom and guidance on items related to their facilities."



Golden Harvest

History of Golf in Iowa



One of the foundational pillars of the IGAF is to preserve and protect the history of the game. One way we have accomplished that is through our partnership with Hall of Fame golf writer Rick Brown. Rick spent an entire year researching and writing a book on the history of golf in Iowa. As you can imagine, this would be a monumental task as the history of golf in Iowa stretches well over a century.

Golf came to Iowa in the late 1800s, planting the seeds for a rich harvest of golf history.

Much of that history, long forgotten, comes to life in "Golden Harvest. Iowa's Rich Golf History."

Written by 11-time Iowa Sportswriter of the Year Rick Brown and commissioned by the Iowa Golf Association, this book is a must-read for those who love the game. Iowa is the home to major champions Jack Fleck, Judy Kimball and Zach Johnson. It's also the home to 254 nine-hole golf courses, the most of any state in the nation.

It has produced many champions who had success in and out of Iowa, like Jack Rule, Steve Spray, Barb Thomas Whitehead, Ann Casey Johnstone, Lucile Robinson, Art Bartlett, John Jacobs, Mike McCoy, Gene Elliott, Sean McCarty, Ken Schall, Joe Brown, Edith Estabrooks, Rudy Knepper and so many more. Junior Golf Grants



Iowa PGA Foundation

- Golf in Schools Program: IGA "Grow the Game" grants funded start-up programs.
- Golf in Schools introduces the game of golf to kids in physical education classes. These classes are taught by Iowa PGA Professionals. This program is designed to teach these students more than just the game of golf. They focus heavily on character building and life skills that will benefit them in their life beyond the classroom.
- The IGAF has been a sponsor of this program and has donated to local schools in the surrounding area.



First Tee

- First Tee is a youth development organization that teaches life skills and healthy habits through the game of golf.
- In 2022, the IGAF donated \$1,000 to each of the Iowa First Tee Chapters (Central Iowa, Quad Cities, Siouxland).
- The IGAF has been an annual sponsor of First Tee Central Iowa and in years past participated in the Putt-Putt @ the Park fundraising event.

- Provide Rules Education Seminars for both organizations.
- Provide live scoring services and support for Girls' High School State Championships.



Midwest Junior Championship

- IGA Rules Officials work as Rules Committee for annual event.
- The Midwest Junior Championship is a premier junior golf championship that has been held annually since 2013.



Waterloo Junior Golf Association

- The IGAF presented the WJGA with a \$1,000 grant in 2022.
- The WJGA is a complete junior golf program for young people between the ages of 12 and 18.

Ann Griffel & Herman Sani Scholarships

\$42,000 Awarded Annually


The IGA Foundation administers two college scholarship programs that annually benefit graduating seniors from Iowa high schools. Each year the IGAF awards \$42,000 between the Ann Griffel and Herman Sani Scholarship Funds.

The IGAF awards \$2,000 Ann Griffel Scholarships to Iowa high school senior girls who intend to further their education at an Iowa institution of higher learning, whether a college, university, or trade school. Since 1963, 253 students have received assistance.

The Herman Sani Scholarship Program is a fouryear scholarship awarded to outstanding graduating seniors who have excelled in academics, community service, and have been involved with golf. Each recipient receives \$8,000 (\$2,000 per year) over a consecutive four-year period. Since 1950, 190 Iowa students have been awarded Sani Scholarships.

Youth on Course



Youth Age 6-18 Play for \$5

Youth on Course is all about access for junior golfers. Kids aged 6-18 can sign up for a yearly membership. Courses participate in the program and offer days and times when YOC members can come to play for \$5 or less. Then the IGA Foundation sends each course a subsidy payment for every round played by a YOC member at the end of each month. Subsidies typically range from \$5-7 per round, meaning the courses realize \$10-12 per YOC round.

IGA/IGAF Executive Director, Chad Pitts, completed a Hundred-Hole-Hike in 2022 to

benefit YOC. The Hundred-Hole-Hike is a national fundraising effort where individuals take on the challenge of playing 100 holes of golf in a single day, walking those holes the entire time. This was the fourth year Chad has completed a hike and each time the miles walked is between 25-27.

This year was another extremely successful 'hike'. The hike raised approximately \$6,500 in donations to YOC. Youth on Course continues to grow year over year (we started here in Iowa in 2018). In 2022 we paid \$18,000 in subsidies back to our participating courses, so raising a significant portion of that with one day's effort (well, not counting the training leading up to it) is definitely worth it.

The program helps drive some "traffic" during off-peak hours to participating courses. In addition, statistics show that over half of YOC rounds are played with a full-paying adult. With this program, we like to think that perhaps the kids are dragging the parents to the golf course, instead of the other way around.

The goals of this program are multiple. We aim to reduce the barrier to trying out golf by decreasing the financial strain (kids only pay \$5!), bringing more business to golf courses when they need it most, and getting families out to play this great game together, more often. The program has become nationwide and is accomplishing these goals!

Turf and Environmental Research

"Super" Support

Each year the IGA and IGAF provide funding for the Iowa State University Turfgrass Extension Service, which provides important information and scientific troubleshooting for golf course superintendents and their facilities throughout Iowa.

In 2022 the Iowa Golf Association Foundation donated \$4,000 to be used to assist Iowa State Univeristy Extension Turfgrass Specialist, Dr. Adam Thoms' travel. Although Dr. Thoms doesn't exclusively support IGA Member Clubs he has been an invaluable asset. Since 2018 Dr. Thoms made over 150 in-person visits to IGA Member Clubs and has supported countless others remotely.

Additionally, the IGA and IGAF provide annual sponsorships to support the Iowa Turfgrass Institute

and the Iowa Turfgrass Conference/Trade Show. The conference offers over 35 unique educational sessions along with a vibrant Trade Show featuring over 70 different exhibitors.

The IGAF will continue to support educational programs that demonstrate best environmental practices that positively address the game's agronomic issues. These programs provide educational benefits to the general public, clubs, and all golfers around the state.
